Finding Our Place in Christ's Story: An Invitation

A favorite image of mine is Christ at a table, surrounded by people. I have different iterations of this image — sometimes the people sitting around him are the disciples and his friends, sometimes there is different food on the table, sometimes it is a different table. But there are two constants in every iteration— Christ is always seated in the center and there's always room for more people at the table. I'm carrying this image into the fall at Second Pres when we'll emphasize three things that emerge out of the image of Christ at a table: The Gospel Message, Being the Welcoming Church, and Using Our Hands, Feet, and Pockets.

Let me share a bit more about these three things. At the center of our faith is Christ and his gospel message that we are loved and saved

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This gospel truth will be emphasized throughout our worship in the preaching, hymns, liturgy, and prayers. Building on that is the belief that because we believe the gospel message, we are eager to welcome others into the life it offers. Second Pres is well-known for being a welcoming church and I want to double-down on that so we open our doors wider to more people who need the good news that they are loved and saved by Christ. Lastly, you'll hear an ongoing invitation for us to use our hands, feet, and pockets inside and outside the church. God has richly blessed us and, in response, we have much to give to the neighborhood around Second, in the city of Little Rock, and throughout our state and country.

Friends in Christ, it is one thing to share these ideas; quite another to live them out. So this fall, you'll receive a consistent invitation to find your place in Christ's story so you can join others in doing the hard and good work of discipleship as we learn how to proclaim the gospel message, live as the welcoming church, and use our hands, feet, and pockets in the city and world.

This invitation begins now as I invite you to peruse the contents of this brochure to see where God is leading you to participate in the life of Second Pres.

ELEMENTARY




Youth Sunday Mornings

We offer three Sunday School classes for our Youth every Sunday morning in the Youth Building from 9:45-10:45 a.m. Our Middle School Class is offered for students in 6-7th Grade. In 8th Grade, students are invited to join our year-long Confirmation Class. Finally, all students in 9-12th Grade meet together for

their own Sunday School Class.

Our Middle School and High School Classes will follow the Feasting on the Word Curriculum. Feasting on the Word Curriculum follows the Revised Common Lectionary and allows everyone from Sunday School to Worship explore the same Bible passage each week. This makes it easy for families to live out their faith together. This curriculum invites youth into the rhythm of the church year. Leaders of each age group are provided with a solid biblical background from the well-known commentary Feasting on the Word. Explore the what, where, so what, and now what of each biblical passage from the lectionary through a variety of learning and teaching styles. Joining the Feast connects education with worship offering suggestions to use during the worship service.





Confirmation will follow the *Confirm not Conform* (Presbyterian) Curriculum from September-March. *Confirm not Conform*, or CnC, is a youth confirmation program that takes confirmation seriously. It exposes youth to a wide range of topics, including Scripture, sacraments, creeds, heresy, prayer, other religions, and serving others, and

asks them to think through what they believe and why. *Confirm not Conform* emphasizes finding one's own voice rather than simply conforming to an external standard. It is a program that respects the work youth do as they explore their faith. We trust that when people put in the effort to articulate what they believe and why, they will make good choices about their next step in faith.


Presbyterian Women


