

All Saints' Sunday Special Music

Mass of the Children, composed by John Rutter, is a large work for youth ensemble, an adult mixed choir, soloists, and wind ensemble. The role of the children's choir is to add a further dimension to the traditional Latin Mass sung by the adult choir, sometimes commenting, sometimes amplifying the meaning and mood. The Mass text itself is mainly sung by the adult choir or the soloists. The children sing specially chosen English texts which reflect upon or illuminate the Latin. The work opens with two verses from Bishop Thomas Ken's morning hymn for the Scholars of Winchester College, and it closes with the children singing his evening hymn with Tallis' timeless melody, as the adults intone the traditional Dona nobis pacem, a prayer for peace. All the members of your music ministry pray that our musical offering of Mass of the Children, this All Saints' Sunday, provides comfort for those congregation members who have lost loved ones this year.
