From the Pastor's Desk

One of my favorite Christmas songs is by the band Rend Collective called *Today Is the Saviour's Day* (They are an Irish band, hence the spelling of Savior!) and it includes two lines that say, "Go tell it on the mountains that hope is alive/ go shout it in the valleys that love has arrived." Both reference us back to the title of the song, *Today is the Saviour's Day* and I keep thinking about how our worship services in Advent will live out the lyrics of their song.

Everything we are doing over the next four Sundays is to lead us to Christmas Eve. What we are called to do over the course of this month is "tell it on the mountain and shout it into the valleys that today is the Savior's Day, that God's love has arrived, and hope is alive," all to prepare for Christ's birth on Christmas Eve. What I think about each time I listen to this song is that there's a key element in that call – we must climb the mountain and descend into the valley to proclaim those truths. This is the reality of the Seasons of Advent and Christmas – one leads to the other and requires work along the path.



This song is partly why I chose the Advent and Christmas Preaching Series and titled it *Claiming a New Story: How God Reorients our Lives.* As you'll soon experience, each Sunday in December includes proclamations from Christ, John the Baptist, Mary, Jesus' mother, and many others seeking to help us reorient our lives to claim God's story. These proclamations aren't simple, and it will require hard work and sacrifice to accomplish them.

They may feel like we are climbing a mountain or descending into a valley – both hard things to do – and they are, but they are not in vain. We don't do them just to do them; we do them because they give us a sense of purpose and meaning.

I think that is what is so life-giving about the good news of the gospels – they give us a purpose and meaning. Think about how much God wants to be in our lives that God comes as a child that will be reared by humans and feel human emotions and experience the pain and suffering that are realities of our lives. But God doesn't want to stop there. No, God wishes for us to participate in this gospel – this good news that brings salvation through hope, love, and grace to the world. We are called to prepare to proclaim that *Today is the Saviour's Day*! God wants us – you and me – to announce this good news to the world.

That's an amazing call and the fact that God wishes for us to participate is something that should fill us with joy and possibility.

Friends in Christ, I'm praying for each of you and hope you are praying for yourselves, this church, and our world. As you peruse this months edition of the newsletter, take some time to see where you might participate in going to the mountain to tell that hope is alive or how you might shout it into the valleys that love has arrived – trust me, there are plenty of opportunities in here!

Blue Christmas: A Service of Hope and Healing


Wednesday, December 18 at 6:00pm in the Chapel



Did you know... about Second Presbyterian's second building?

Second Presbyterian's second building was located at the southeast corner of 3rd and Gaines streets in downtown Little Rock. The building was designed by Little Rock architects Sanders & Ginocchio and was built between March and December 1925 at a cost of \$250,000. The first service was held in the building on December 20, 1925. The building served as the home of Second Presbyterian until 1969 when the current building was built in Pleasant Valley. Second Presbyterian's second building was demolished in the summer of 1969 and the location is now a parking lot for the Federal Building. If you're looking to learn more about Second Presbyterian Church and its long history in Little Rock, check out the resources in the Heritage Room. 
Presbyterian Women December 2024

Second Presbyterian Church Environmental Stewardship Christmas Tips

Second Presbyterian Church Environmental Stewardship Have an Environmentally Sustainable Christmas!

Every year these are dumped in landfills: over 12,500 tons of Christmas decorations 141,525 tons of food packaging 30,000 tons of Christmas cards This is not counting gift packaging, food waste, unused gifts!

Try these suggestions instead:

1. Christmas Wrapping Paper: Avoid plastic, glitter, foil. Use these:

*newspapers, magazines (comics, sports, style sections)
*old bags and cardboard boxes, old shoe boxes
*reuse fabrics/clothes as wrapping paper and ribbons

2. Christmas Trees.

*Live trees are often better than artificial trees: less impact on environment. In tree farms, live trees help balance air, can be recycled as compost, sometimes can be replanted.

*Keep artificial trees many years. Get them second hand, or make one from recyclable materials.

3. Christmas decorations

*Use old family pictures, children's drawings, paper snowflakes.

*Create decorations from newspapers, cardboard, reused fabrics.

4. Gifts

*Share what you have.

*Make a family scrapbook, write down family stories to share.
